Thankfully, we appear to be in a lull when it comes to the Covid-19 pandemic. Unfortunately, we don't seem to know when it may rear its ugly head again with another spike or outbreak. Many in our country are living in a heightened state of anxiety. What will be the by-product of this heightened state? Add to that the difficulties we have all faced over the past two years involving death, isolation, and fear. These have not been easy times.

Service providers are showing statistics revealing another side effect of the pandemic and that is the widespread psychological trauma that many across our nation have felt, and nowhere has that been felt more, than among our youth.

Our youth have had to struggle with isolation, fear, anxiety, and uncertainties impacting every part of their lives. Their academic habits were interrupted by schools closing, followed by needing to adapt to e-learning. They were isolated within their homes, away from friends, with adults who were struggling with loss of jobs, isolation, and a complete disruption of their daily lives. Where does this leave us as we look to the future?

Nearly half of Americans report that the pandemic harmed their mental health, according to a Kaiser Family Foundation poll. A federal emergency hotline for people in emotional distress registered a more than 1,000% increase

in the first guarter of 2022, when compared with pre-pandemic numbers. Data is showing that depression and anxiety are already roiling the nation.

Wernle is here to help answer the call and provide solutions for youth and families during these difficult times. Thankfully, with your help we have recently completed renovations on our oldest residential building. Adding a beautiful new atrium to the front, providing an all-season space filled with natural light for therapy sessions. We completely refreshed the interior of the building providing remodeled bathrooms, and new lighting throughout. We removed walls so that the space has a more open floor plan, and remodeled office spaces. Finally, we expanded the day room adding new seating, television, and interior play space. All of these renovations also allowed us to add additional beds to the unit so that more youth can be served.

We have plans to renovate 2 additional residential units on our campus. These renovations will also allow us to serve more young people. 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

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
